

American Walnut

BOTANICAL NAMES

Juglans nigra L.
It belongs to the Juglanaceae family.

TRADE NAMES

Noyer d'Amerique - France Black walnut - Great Britain Black walnut, canaletto - Italy Black hickory nut, Canadian walnut, waney black walnut - United States

GROWING AREA

The tree is readily found in the northeastern United States, but it also grows as far south as Florida and Texas.

TECHNOLOGICAL FEATURES

The whitish sapwood is clearly differentiated from the heartwood, which is rather dark and variegated. Medium to coarse-textured and generally straight-grained, the wood is hard, rather heavy, but at the same time quite pliable and elastic. When fresh it has a very characteristic intense scent. It is moderately resistant.

SPECIFIC WEIGHT

When dried in the air it has a specific weight ranging from 650 to 700 Kg/m3.

DRYING METHOD

The drying process is easy, despite some risk of collapse.

MAIN USES AND WORKING

This wood is easy to work using any tool: joints with nails and screws are easy and resistant. It can also be sanded and varnished with excellent results. Good-looking veneers are used extensively in the furniture industry for interior decoration, and in carpentry and cabinetry for gunstocks, furniture, and frames.
